“The addition of evidently beneficial infrastructure, at regular intervals, with a consistent, dignified and contemporary presence need have no impact upon the appreciation of the heritage character and significance of the Lake and surrounds” John Briggs, Architect

1 The introduction of lighting is not likely to disrupt any heritage experience of the lake and surrounds.

2 The historical, social and scientific significance will not be altered by the introduction of lighting and is reinforced by existing lighting which does not impact on the Lake’s heritage and aesthetic values.

3 The introduction of a rhythmic circuit of light to the Steve Moneghetti Track may help to re-establish a sense of coherence to the lake perimeter, rather than being experienced as disruptive of any heritage experience of the lake and surround.

4 Lighting can be accommodated without adversely affecting the heritage significance and value of Lake Wendouree.

5 The understanding of the historical, social and scientific significance will not be altered by the introduction of contextually responsive and evidently beneficial infrastructure (lighting).
